In an era when judges handed down death sentences as easily as they toasted the good health of the monarch, someone had to do the dirty work of the authorities. Today, the noseless hangman who sparked fear and fascination everywhere he went between 1876 and 1904 is largely forgotten, yet Howard is vital to understanding attitudes towards capital punishment in Australia.
