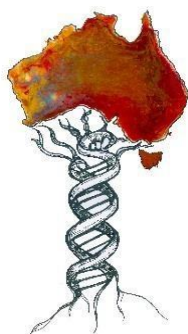


Related Histories: Studying the Family

We all tell stories about our family history but why do we do this? How have we done it in the past? How might we do it differently in the future?

Related Histories offers an opportunity for family historians to explore family history-making from a range of different perspectives and to build relationships between academic and non-academic researchers.

Attendees will have the opportunity to meet leading practitioners, contribute to debates and share their own experiences.

Speakers include Nick Brodie (*Kin*, 2015), Tim Bonyhady (*Good Living Street*, 2011), Jenny Hocking (*The Dismissal Dossier*, 2015).

Two sessions will explore practical issues related to family history:

Day 1: Work in Progress: family history researchers will share the pleasures, pitfalls and problems of their research.

Day 2: Family History in the Making: a range of experts including archivists, librarians, and genealogists will share their work and offer insight and advice into researching family history.

Key note lecture: Graeme Davison, 28th November, 6.30-7.30pm, National Library of Australia

Graeme Davison, author of the acclaimed *Lost Relations: Fortunes of My Family in Australia's Golden Age* (2015), will deliver the conference's key note lecture in which he will reflect on his research process and the impact of this for his historical thinking. The lecture is a free public event.
